Helping people be healthy and well increases their opportunities to achieve their goals and potential. Friendship is a key component of health. According to author Madeline Vann, friendships "yield a multitude of long-term physical and emotional health benefits. Maintaining positive relationships should rank up there with healthy eating and exercise as a necessary investment in your health." Thus we consider friendship – and its related joys – as important matters at Dakota Communities.

At Dakota Communities we are making investments in the health of the people we serve in multiple ways. In this Annual Report you can see some of the results of our investments in volunteerism and pet therapy.

When 17-year-old Brittany Johnson decided to volunteer at Dakota Communities' Mendota Heights home, she wasn't quite sure what to expect. Just moments after meeting 44-year-old Elaine, however, she realized this match might just be the beginning of a great friendship.

Brittany remembers, “I saw her shelf of movies and realized most of them were films I also enjoyed.” That mutual love of movies helped to break down barriers as they were soon watching Elvis movies – both are crazy about “The King” – and singing and dancing along to *Hairspray*.

Brittany and Elaine have gotten together for two hours every week for nearly a year, and their pairing has blossomed into a relationship they both enjoy. Jessica Anderson, Program Coordinator at the home where Elaine lives, says, “Now they've found so many more shared interests, like beading earrings, making cards, and listening to music.”

While she also enjoys volunteering at an assisted living facility, Brittany recognizes the difference at Dakota Communities: “Here I really get to know people and make friends. Elaine and I are very close, and our friendship is mutually rewarding.” She's quick to add that volunteering is “lots of fun”: not at all like work.

While Elaine says she likes making jewelry and watching movies with Brittany, Jessica also notes the importance of Brittany's listening skills. Elaine is incredibly social and loves to share her experiences and ideas. So having two hours of “Elaine Time” – a time when someone other than staff can listen and support her – has been a great addition to Elaine's life.

“She is so fun to work with. She has a lot of spirit,” says Brittany. The fact that Elaine uses a “talker,” a machine to help her speak, has “taught me a lot about communication,” she adds.

Their relationship is an excellent example of how the power of friendship creates joy. More than just fun, friendships like these can “yield a multitude of long-term physical and emotional health benefits,” according to author Madeline Vann. “Maintaining positive relationships,” says Vann, “should rank up there with healthy eating and exercise as a necessary investment in your health.”

According to the Dakota Communities 2010 Family/Guardian Survey, 83% of the people we support have friends beyond their family and staff members. Every day volunteers like Brittany create valuable bonds that increase wellness and raise spirits.

“I know Elaine looks forward to Brittany coming every week,” comments Jessica with a cheerful laugh. “I can hear her all the way back in her room calling out with excitement when Brittany arrives.” It's that enthusiasm – and a whole lot of laughs – that have brought joy into the lives of two very different yet remarkably similar women.

At Dakota Communities' Inndale home in Lakeville, the combined personalities of five unique, interesting women can make any day joyful. When you add a pet to the mix, you're likely to see even more smiles. That's what Inndale staff members have noticed since the addition of Norway, the house cat, and Sam, a therapy dog that visits every Wednesday with his owner, Nici.

When the home of women living with multiple disabilities adopted Norway a couple years ago, Mary immediately bonded with her. In fact, she grew so attached – and enjoyed giving her treats so much – that she asked if Norway could stay in her room. Kim Pierce, Program Coordinator at the Inndale home, has now grown accustomed to the site of Mary reading her Bible as the cat sits peacefully alongside her. “Norway wasn’t initially part of a pet therapy program,” notes Kim, “but she’s been very therapeutic for Mary.”

While Mary’s lucky to have her feline friend around every day, she and the other women of Inndale must patiently wait for Wednesdays to spend time with Sam, the Golden Retriever who comes each week with his owner. Kay, in particular, has fallen for this gentle, loving dog that likes to rest his nose and head on her lap to be petted (and, of course, get spoiled with treats). Kay comments, “It’s great when they come. It makes a cheerful atmosphere.”

In the summer, Nici, Sam, and the women go for walks outside, something Kim sees as very important: “It’s nice for them to get out into the neighborhood. Walking a dog makes them feel like they’re part of the community.”

Pet therapy provides many benefits from helping people develop nurturing skills and an outward focus to encouraging relaxation and socialization.¹ What Kim appreciates most of all is that visits with Sam give the women some sense of normalcy. “The bond an animal can give – no questions, no judgments – is something that most people just can’t offer,” Kim notes. “It’s pure, innocent companionship.”

The women’s love for animals – and the incredible bonds Mary and Kay have created with Norway and Sam – have inspired “Doggy Fridays” as well. That’s a much-anticipated time when family members bring their dogs to visit at Inndale. Given that Mary’s four daughters each have a dog and Kay’s daughter has a puppy, “Doggy Fridays” always cause a few laughs and a whole lot of joy.

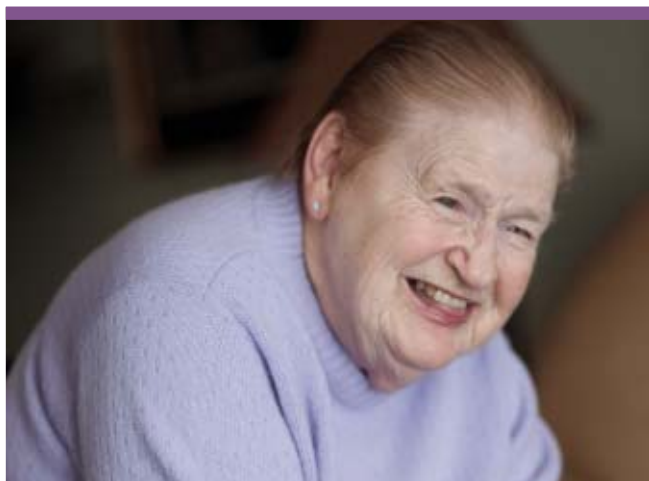

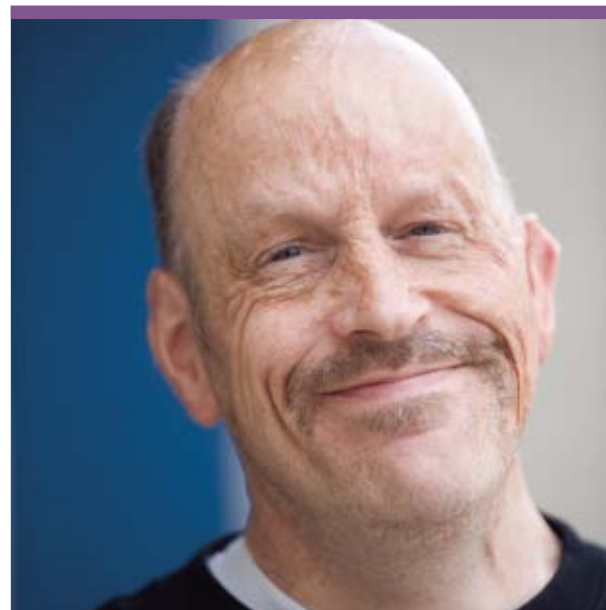
